
LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY ELECTION OF KARNATAKA 2023

FROM HEALING TO HARM

n May 10th 2023, a young house surgeon, Dr. Vandana Das was fatally stabbed to death while on hospital duty by a patient brought in for treatment by the police at Kollam Taluk Hospital Kerala. The accused alleged to be a drug addict was brought to the hospital without proper custody. On the very same day a resident doctor from the nephrology department in NIMS Hyderabad was assaulted by the patient's attendants, followed by the death of a 62 year old woman. These are not single occurrences.

Tensions have escalated all over the state after the death of Dr. Vandana Das which has led to numerous strikes by medical professionals across the state. Multiple cases have been recorded where the patient or the attendants of patients attack the doctors. During the onset of COVID -19, doctors were glorified as divine and superheroes but now the condition is quite the opposite where they are barely considered humane. The victims are mostly young doctors or resident doctors out of which many are females. A study conducted by the Indian Medical Association (IMA) states that 75 % of doctors have encountered violence at some point of time but predominantly early in their career. The attacks arise due to different problems like failure from the administrative dissatisfaction, end, patient miscommunication.

The shortage of healthcare personnels is one important reason for the lack of efficient treatment for the poor. The Indian economy spends very little for the healthcare sector which can be considered as an administrative failure. As the population rate is skyrocketing, there is an increased necessity for the number of healthcare personnels in the country. As a result of the high medical fees and lesser seats in Medical Colleges, people are flooding out of the country for learning medicine. Most of them are reluctant to come back due to the strenuous working conditions prevailing in the country. Very often, the doctors are taught the surgical and medical procedures but not effective communication. Lack of empathy from the doctors often triggers the patients and their attendees and to equip them with this skill is the need of the hour.

Healthcare belongs to the State List. A lot of states have implemented laws to protect the doctors but the execution is not effective. According to the Indian Penal Code, "Violence against a healthcare service personnel causing grievous harm is punishable with imprisonment between three years and ten years, and a fine between two lakh rupees and ten lakh rupees." The Government of Kerala is planning to include verbal abuse under the provision of grievous harm. Many States, both public and private are employing highly equipped and skilled security officers to protect their doctors from these violences. These are all preventive measures and not permanent solutions. The change should happen from the base level. The number of educated people getting involved in these cases are very less. Educating people from the primary level and making healthcare available for all can make a significant change in the long run.

marriage, it also does not recognize it an official registered marriage. So, a group of 18 same sex couples filed a petition Supreme Court to legalize same sex marriage.






