7. Brief about the event:

The National Cadet Corps (NCC) unit of **St. Francis College, Koramangala**, has set an inspiring example of humanitarian service by extending relief support to flood-affected families in **Manderwada village, Jewargi taluk of Kalaburagi district**, which was severely hit by the recent heavy rains and floods in North Karnataka. The relief initiative took place on **October 16, 2025**.

During the floods, many residents had taken shelter in safer areas. Upon returning home, they found their food grains and essential supplies completely destroyed, leaving several families struggling to sustain themselves. Recognising their hardship, the NCC volunteers of St. Francis College decided to distribute **free food kits** to the affected families.

Distribution of Over 50 Relief Kits

With the wholehearted support of the **college management, faculty, and students**, and under the guidance of **Associate NCC Officer Lt. Amaregouda**, the cadets organised the relief drive. They prepared more than **50 kits** containing essential items such as rice, pulses, wheat flour, sugar, salt, bread packets, and other daily necessities.

The NCC volunteers travelled directly from Bengaluru to Manderwada village, where they personally distributed the kits to over 50 families with the cooperation of local residents. By engaging directly with the flood victims and offering their assistance, the students exemplified the true spirit of **selfless service**

and compassion. The noble gesture earned heartfelt appreciation from the villagers and community elders.
